IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM

Complainant has now filed a fourth complaint against a long-retired judge based on adverse decisions made by that judge several years ago. After the third complaint was dismissed, the Seventh Circuit Judicial Council on March 7, 2018, required Complainant to tender a \$1,000 deposit before he could file another judicial misconduct complaint. He has deposited \$1,000 along with his fourth complaint against the same judge. The March 7, 2018 order provides that the deposit will be returned if the Chief Judge determines that a complaint has any arguable merit.

This fourth complaint is like the others which were dismissed. The complaint attacks the judge's rulings. The complaint is dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii) and (iii). As the complaint has no arguable merit, the \$1,000 deposit will not be refunded and will be sent to the United States Treasury.
