IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST THREE JUDGES

MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint against three judges, two of whom are retired. The complainant was not pleased with the counsel who was recruited to represent complainant in the underlying litigation. Complainant was also upset that a second attorney was not recruited. Finally complainant wanted her case reassigned to a new judge.

Any complaint that is “directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling” must be dismissed. 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii). *See also* Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. “Any allegation that calls into question the correctness of an official action of a judge...is merits related.” Standard 2 for Assessing Compliance with the Act, *Implementation of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980: A Report to the Chief Justice* 145 (2006).

This is the third complaint filed by complainant. Complainant is warned that filing future insubstantial complaints may result in my recommendation to the Seventh Circuit Judicial Council that she be required to post a bond of \$1,000 before future complaints are considered.

This complaint is dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii).
