### **CIRCUIT RULE 46. Attorneys**

...

**(b) Admission Fees.** The prescribed fee for admission is a ~~\$15.00~~ local fee as set forth in the Seventh Circuit Attorney Admission Local Fee Order, plus a national fee prescribed by the Court of Appeals Miscellaneous Fee Schedule, ~~except that~~ Attorneys who have been appointed by the district court or this court to represent a party on appeal in forma pauperis, law clerks to judges of this court or the district courts, pursuant to the Criminal Justice Act under 18 U.S.C. § 3006A and attorneys employed by the United States or any agency thereof need not pay the fee its

executive and legislative agencies are exempt from the admission fees. The clerk shall receive the \$15.00 local fee as trustee of the lawyers fund and shall deposit it in a bank designated by the court. Payments from the fund shall be made for the purchase of law books, for library conveniences, or other court purposes, by checks duly signed by the clerk as trustee and countersigned by two judges of this court. Local admission fees are segregated and retained in a designated Attorney Admission Fund administered by the custodian in accordance with the Seventh Circuit Attorney Admission Fund Plan.
