## MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against the judge who presides over his civil case, but his allegations are vague, conclusory, utterly unsupported, and frivolous. Accordingly, the complaint must be dismissed under 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

The complainant filed a similar misconduct complaint against the same judge in 2020, which I summarily dismissed for the same reasons. The conduct complained of in this complaint and the previous one clearly falls outside the scope of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act. § 352(b)(1)(A). Repetitive filing of noncognizable misconduct complaints is an abuse of the Act. Rule 10(a) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings* empowers the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit to prohibit, restrict, or impose conditions on an abusive complainant's use of the complaint procedure. If the complainant abuses the provisions of the Act by filing another misconduct complaint that is summarily dismissed as frivolous, merits related, and/or not within the scope of the Act, I will consider asking the Judicial Council to require him to post a \$1,000 bond before any future complaints are reviewed. *See* RULES FOR JUD.-MISCONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. 10(a).

For the foregoing reasons, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. 28 U.S.C. § 352(c); *see* RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk's office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
