IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against the judge who dismissed his civil case. His complaint does not contain a statement of facts describing the alleged misconduct. Instead, he refers to an attached docket-entry notification that includes a hand-written notation at the top stating “claim of public breach of trust 760 ILCS 3/1002.”

The complaint is frivolous and wholly unsupported. Allegations of misconduct must be supported by sufficient facts to raise an inference that misconduct occurred. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). The complaint also is not in conformity with the requirements of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act because it fails to contain a statement of the facts supporting the claim of misconduct. *Id.* § 352(b)(1)(A)(i); *see* RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 6(b) (“A complaint must contain a concise statement that details the specific facts on which the claim of misconduct or disability is based.”).

Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to § 352(b)(1)(A)(i) and (iii). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. 28 U.S.C. § 352(c); *see* RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk’s office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
