IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against the judge who dismissed her civil-rights case. Her complaint is difficult to decipher and primarily focuses on the legitimacy of garnishment proceedings in state court. She generally alleges that “corruption and bribery” influenced the adverse outcomes in the state and federal proceedings and “suspects” that there was “money issued to money mules for the payment of corruption and services related to the protection of the corruption.”

This complaint is frivolous. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). A complainant must provide sufficient facts to raise an inference of misconduct; an adverse outcome alone is not sufficient.

Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. *Id.* § 352(c); *see* RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk’s office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
