## IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

#### MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against the judge who denied his habeas petition and dismissed his civil-rights case. He challenges the judge's decisions, alleging that the judge improperly denied his motion to stay his habeas proceedings and disregarded his "own established precedent" in dismissing his case because he had previously determined that the complainant stated a claim against the defendants.

These allegations relate directly to the merits of the judge's decisions and thus are not proper grounds for a misconduct complaint. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii); RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 4(b)(1) cmt.

Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. 28 U.S.C. § 352(c); *see* RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk's office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
