IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against the chief judge of a district court. He does not allege any misconduct by the judge. Rather, he alleges that the federal courts in general discriminate against persons with disabilities by not providing free legal representation in civil matters, failing to provide no-cost access to PACER, and failing to provide free “deposition services.” He also complains about a lack of access to “administrative claim offices and services.”

To commence a proceeding under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act, a misconduct complaint against a judge must contain a statement of the facts constituting the alleged misconduct. 28 U.S.C. § 351(a). This complaint contains no allegation of misconduct by the subject judge. It is therefore not in conformity with § 351(a) and must be dismissed. *Id.* § 352(b)(1)(A)(i).

Accordingly, the complaint is dismissed pursuant to § 352(b)(1)(A)(i). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. 28 U.S.C. § 352(c); *see* RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk’s office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
