IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST TWO JUDGES

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against two judges—the district judge who entered summary judgment against him in his discrimination/retaliation case and a circuit judge who ruled against him on appeal.

The complaint alleges that the judges’ actions are “part of some sort of deep state cover up” related to the “Zersetzung/Gangstalking” program, which the complainant describes as “a form of covert domestic torture/terrorism/non-consensual human experimentation/social engineering program deployed on unsuspecting citizens,” subjecting them to (among other things) stalking, harassment, and spying by law enforcement, first responders, and “people from all walks of life.” The complainant claims to be a victim of this program. As it relates to the “non-consensual human experimentation,” the complainant further asserts that he “may possibly have nanotechnology (Smart Dust)” in his bloodstream, which he claims gives the government the ability to “tap into [his] consciousness and to remotely view [his] biological functions.”

This nonsensical complaint is dismissed as frivolous. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. *Id.* § 352(c); see RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk’s office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
