IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM AND ORDER

The complainant filed a misconduct complaint against the district judge who dismissed one of his employment discrimination cases more than two years ago. The allegations are disjointed and bizarre: the complainant accuses the judge of “sowing hate and division in the course of the litigation” and “scaring” him by scheduling a hearing on “Oct. 31 Halloween.” He further alleges that the judge endangered his life and “the public and Judiciary as a whole” and was part of a conspiracy against him. All this, the complainant says, compromised his case and caused him to suffer “depression and mental illness.”

A misconduct complaint must be supported by sufficient facts to raise an inference that misconduct has occurred. 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). The complainant’s allegations are unsupported, largely nonsensical, and frivolous.

Accordingly, this complaint is dismissed pursuant to § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii). The complainant may petition the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit for review of this order in accordance with Rule 18(b) of the *Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings*. 28 U.S.C. § 352(c); see RULES FOR JUD.-CONDUCT & JUD.-DISABILITY PROC. r. 11(g)(3). A petition for review must be filed in the clerk’s office of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit not later than 42 days of the date of this order.
