IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST 15 JUDGES

MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed complaints against 15 (six trial and nine appellate) judges with the common theme that they all were part of a criminal conspiracy along with certain state and federal government officials and private attorneys, to deprive complainant of his civil rights. The conspiracy allegedly commenced with complainant's conviction and continued through the processing of his subsequent multiple civil suits and appeals. The complainant alleges a failure to convene an investigation into widespread misconduct in the federal court system and calls for the impeachment of the aforementioned judges.

The Judicial Conference of the United States adopted the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 358. The Commentary on Rule 11(c)(1)(C) provides that: "when the allegations are facially incredible or so lacking in indicia of reliability that no further inquiry is warranted, dismissal under this subsection is appropriate." With regard to the instant complaints, an examination of the underlying allegations reveals the indicia of reliability to be absent.

The complaints are dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii) and Rule 11(c)(1)(C) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings.
