IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDICIAL OFFICER

MEMORANDUM

Complainant believes that a district judge committed misconduct by dismissing three of his suits without recruiting counsel to represent him, and by concluding that these three suits satisfy 28 U.S.C. §1915(g) and thus prevent complainant from filing additional suits *in forma pauperis* unless he is in imminent physical danger.

Any complaint that is “directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling” must be dismissed. 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii). See also Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability proceedings. “Any allegation that calls into question the correctness of an official action of a judge ... is merits related.” Standard 2 for Assessing Compliance with the Act, *Implementation of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980: A Report to the Chief Justice* 145 (2006). The allegations of this complaint fit that description. If complainant believes that the judge has erred, he may present his arguments by timely appeals from the final decisions.
