## **MEMORANDUM**

Complainant is a repeat filer. This is his sixth during my time as chief judge. He has been twice warned that the filing of frivolous complaints will lead to an order by the Judicial Council curtailing his access to the mechanisms of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980. The most recent warning came in proceeding No. 07-08-90101.

The current complaint asserts that the subject judge is engaged in identity theft and has violated complainant's trademarks. The complaint does not contain any specifics and thus must be dismissed under 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(iii). Complainant does not tell me what the judge has done to deserve a charge of identity theft (surely the judge is not trying to pass herself off as complainant, or to obtain credit on his account) or trademark violations. The complaint is frivolous.

I direct complainant to show cause within 14 days why the Judicial Council should not enter an order curtailing his ability to file additional frivolous charges. See Rule 10(a) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings.
