MEMORANDUM

This is complainant's third complaint against one judge and to it she has added my predecessor who dismissed both of those earlier complaints. Both previous complaints have been dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii) as they dealt with the judge's rulings. The allegation against my predecessor is that he "sat in" on the federal trial of her son and appeal. The docket sheet shows that he did not participate in a judicial capacity; there is also no indication that he was present in the courtroom. Furthermore, such actions, if true, would not constitute judicial misconduct.

As there is nothing in this complaint that constitutes judicial misconduct by either judge, this complaint is dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(ii) and (iii).

My predecessor's order dismissing the second complaint warned the complainant that any future misuse of the judicial misconduct complaint procedure will result in a recommendation to the Seventh Circuit Judicial Council to curtail complainant's ability to misuse the complaint procedure. Complainant, as is shown by this complaint, did not heed the warning. Complainant is given until December 15, 2014 to respond as to why the Seventh Circuit Judicial Council should not enter an order curtailing complainant's abuse of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980. See Rule 10(a) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings.
