IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint against the judge assigned to his cases. The complaint is with the judge's rulings. He asks that he have a hearing on the merits in one of his cases, that criminal charges be brought against the attorneys of record in two of his cases, that they be ordered to pay complainant's filing fees, and that strikes against him under the Prisoner Litigation Reform Act be waived.

There is no jurisdiction over attorneys under the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1988.

Any complaint that is "directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling" must be dismissed. 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii). See also Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. "Any allegation that calls into question the correctness of an official action of a judge...is merits related." Standard 2 for Assessing Compliance with the Act, *Implementation of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980: A Report to the Chief Justice* 145 (2006).

Therefore this complaint is dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii).
