MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint against two judges assigned to his case. The complaint is that the judges have conspired to intentionally mishandle complainant's cases. The complaint against one judge is that the judge's rulings are evidence of the judge's intentional mishandling. Complainant also alleges that the judges had a notice of appeal filed to require complainant to pay fees. There is nothing in the complaint that constitutes judicial misconduct. The misconduct process is not to be used for judicial acts. The complaint is frivolous.

Repetitive filing of insubstantial judicial misconduct complaints is an abuse of the provisions of the Judicial Conduct and Disabilities Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. §§351-364. If complainant continues to abuse the provisions of the Act, I will ask the Seventh Circuit Judicial Council to require complainant to post a \$1,000 bond before any future complaints are reviewed.

Therefore this complaint is dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(iii).
