MEMORANDUM

Complainant, who was convicted in a federal criminal prosecution and later filed a civil suit in federal court, contends that the judge who presided in these cases committed misconduct by "constitution disobedience, motion of character, character assassination, deliberate indifference, genocidal."

This complaint repeats allegations made, considered, and rejected three months ago in No. 07-7-352-11. To the extent it does anything other than express disagreement with the district judge's rulings—a subject beyond the scope of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act, as my prior decision informed complainant—it is unrelated to the federal judiciary and thus both outside the scope of the Act and frivolous.

Complainant does not offer any explanation for filing this repetitious charge. Complainant is advised that any further, similar filing will lead the Council to consider issuing an order restricting his use of the 1980 Act's processes. See Rule 1(f) of the Rules of the Judicial Council of the Seventh Circuit Governing Complaints of Judicial Misconduct or Disability.
