MEMORANDUM

Complainant is a frustrated litigant who believes that the "above mention known intiy as a judge of the united state federal court, has has many patern's of misconduct & very bad habit of trowing out case's that are rightfull case's that he should've had resolved . insteand he had them dismissed & didnt even bother to read them knowing I had no counsil on my docket" [all errors in original]. The complaint does not contain any further information or argument, though it does attach some of the papers filed in cases that the district judge dismissed.

Any complaint that is "directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling" must be dismissed. 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii). See also Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. "Any allegation that calls into question the correctness of an official action of a judge ... is merits related." Standard 2 for Assessing Compliance with the Act, *Implementation of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980: A Report to the Chief Justice* 145 (2006). The allegations of this complaint fit that description. If complainant believes that the district judge erred, the remedy is by appeal rather than a complaint under the 1980 Act.
