IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed a judicial misconduct complaint against the judge assigned to her case. Complainant has filed multiple lawsuits. The complainant contends that her latest case was “fixed” when it was reassigned to the complained about judge who had one of complainant’s earlier lawsuits. The judge dismissed the case. If the transfer of the case and its dismissal is erroneous, the remedy is by appeal.

Any complaint that is “directly related to the merits of a decision or procedural ruling” must be dismissed. 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii). *See also* Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. “Any allegation that calls into question the correctness of an official action of a judge...is merits related.” Standard 2 for Assessing Compliance with the Act, *Implementation of the Judicial Conduct and Disability Act of 1980: A Report to the Chief Justice* 145 (2006). There is no misconduct.

This complaint is dismissed pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §352(b)(1)(A)(ii).
