IN RE COMPLAINT AGAINST A JUDGE

MEMORANDUM

Complainant has filed another frivolous complaint against a judge assigned to his case. That complaint is dismissed as frivolous 28 U.S.C. § 352(b)(1)(A)(iii).

Complainant earlier filed a complaint against that judge plus five more judges. I dismissed that complaint as frivolous. Complainant's second complaint was against me for dismissing the first complaint. Another judge considered that second complaint pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 351(c) and dismissed it as frivolous. That judge warned complainant that filing frivolous complaints was an abuse of the provisions of the Judicial Conduct and Disabilities Act of 1980, 28 U.S.C. § 351-364, and that, if he continued, the Seventh Circuit Judicial Council might require him to post a \$1,000 bond before allowing him to file any further complaints. *See* Rule 10(a) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. That time has come.

Complainant has until July 1, 2016 to respond as to why he should not be required to post a \$1,000 bond with any future complaint which would be returned if the complaint was not frivolous.
